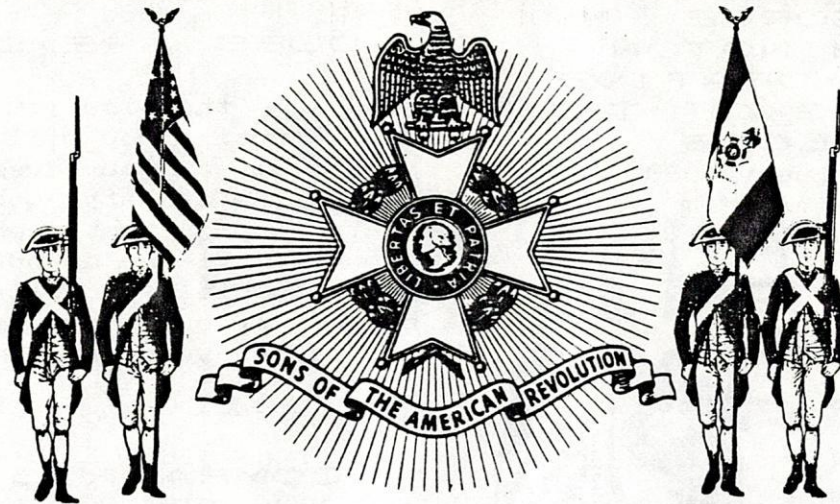
THE FRONT COVER

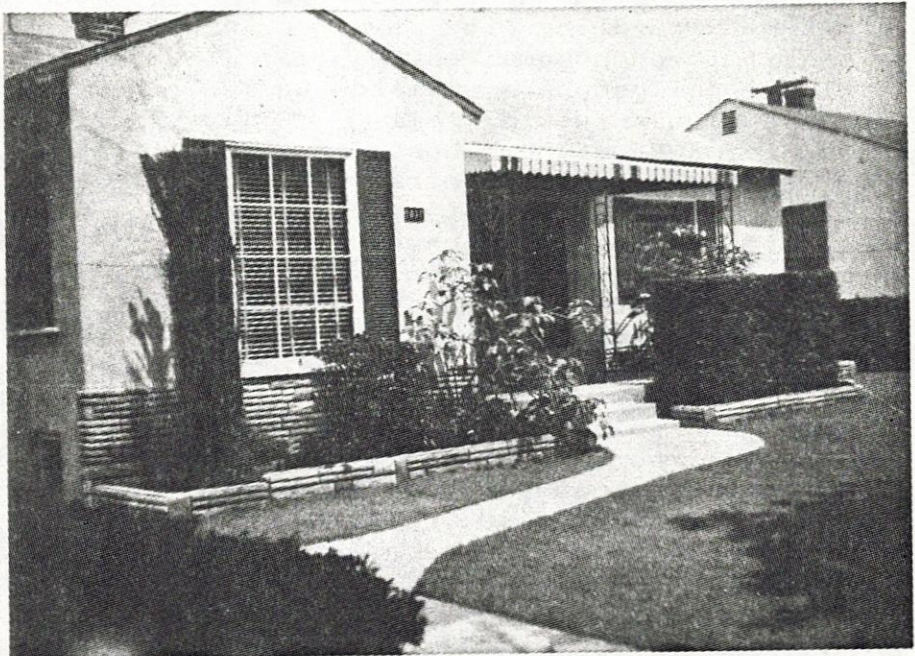

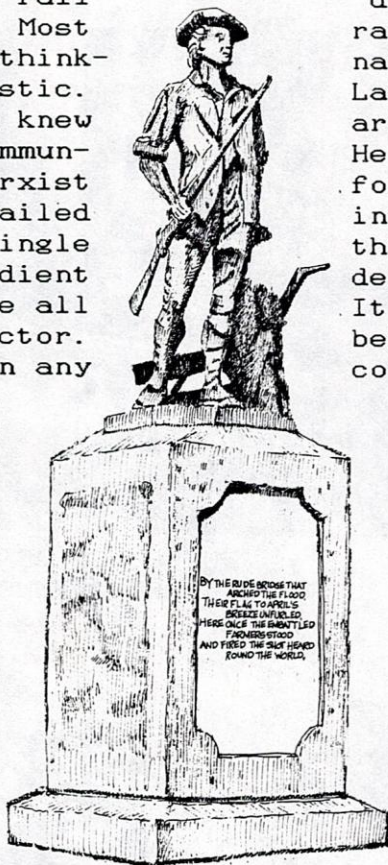

PERESTROIKA

In the last few months we have been privileged to watch history unfold in front of our eyes. The recent events in Eastern Europe are mind-boggling to say the least. Our colonial forefathers recognized the need for a quick response to threats to the public safety so they decreed that 1 in every 3 militia men would be designated a "Minuteman", ready to respond to any attack with only a "minute's notice". We are advocating that we retain this insight of our colonial forefathers and continue our vigilance. Let us all pray that the collapse of the communist empire is as it seems, but, if we are being duped, let us have a strong force of "Minutemen" ready to protect us and the free world.

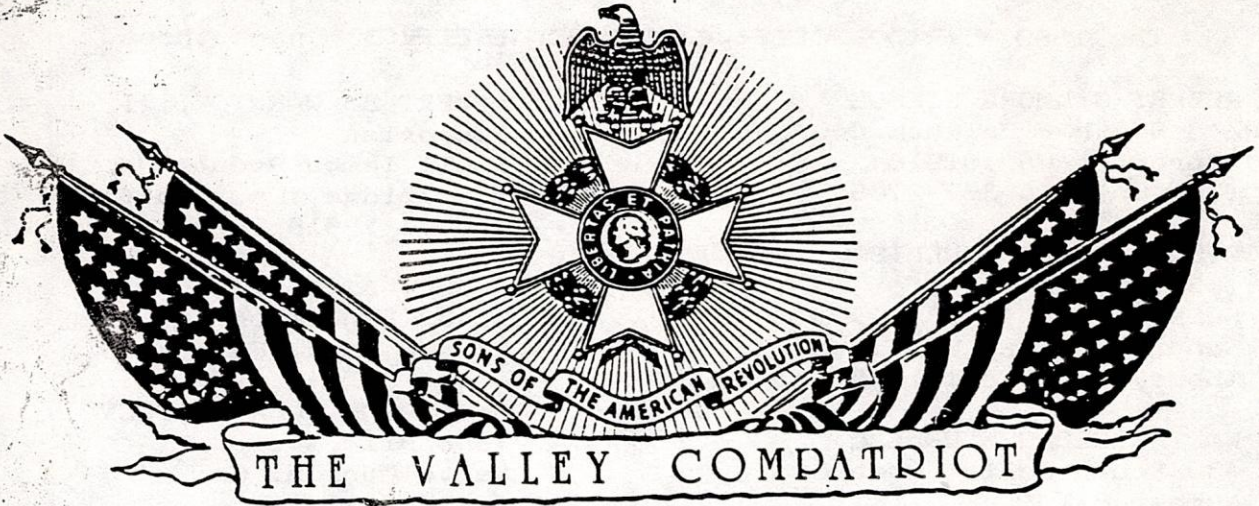
