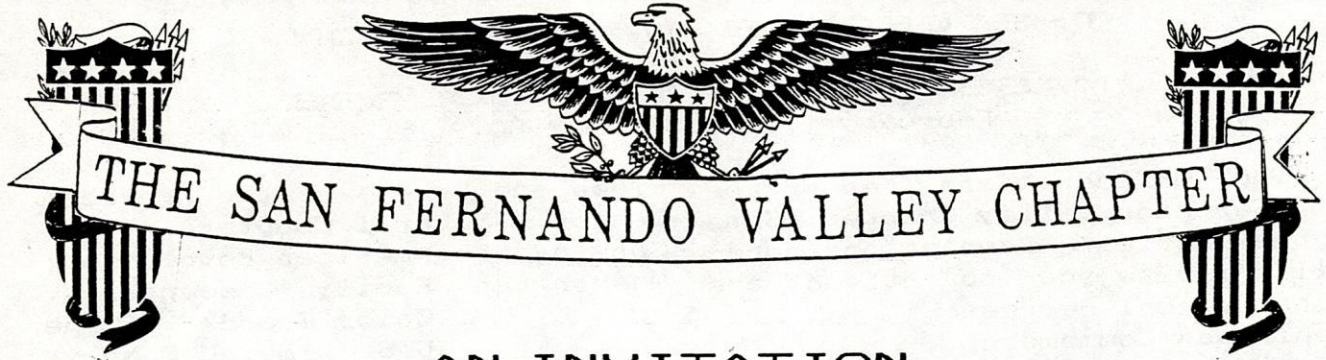

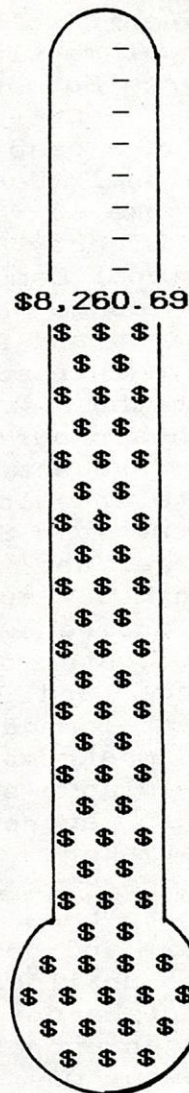

PUNCH BOWL MEMORIAL  
 PROJECT COMPLETED

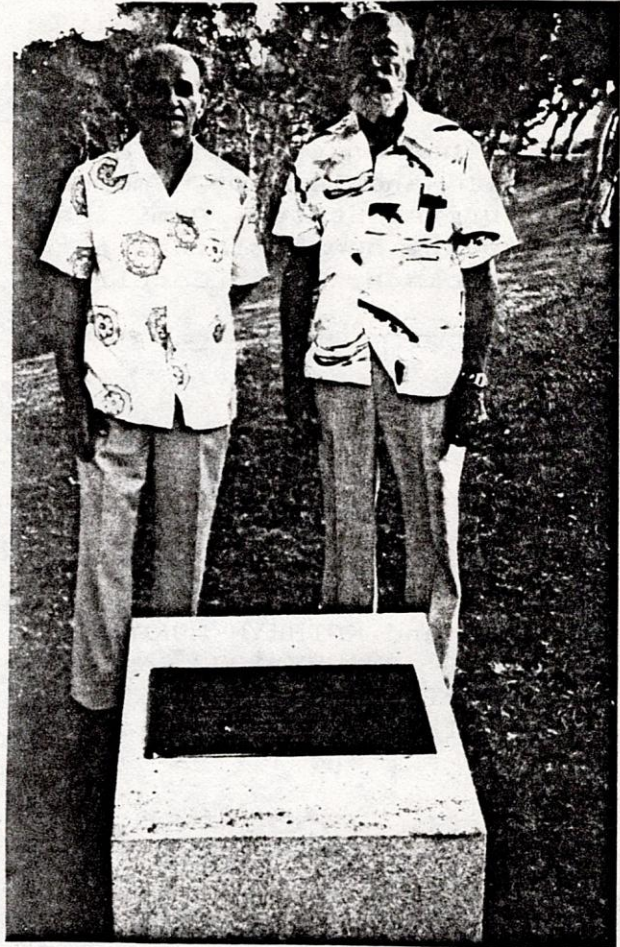


On the 27th of April 1985 the California Society of the Sons of the American Revolution held their Annual meeting in San Diego. Our **George Sutherland Van Dorn**, as our Chapter's President introduced a resolution to assist the National Park Service in its efforts to establish "the Walk of Liberty" at the Punch Bowl National Cemetery in Hawaii.

George had learned of the project and felt our assistance was much needed. He recommended that the S.A.R. erect a monument to honor our Nation's war dead. The project rightfully needed State and National support.

At the San Deigo meeting, George not only received the unanimous approval, but raised the entire amount needed to fund the costs of having a bronze plaque and a vermont granite pedestal made.

Compatriot **Van Dorn** drafted the plaque's inscription, and had it approved. Found a monument maker, ordered the plaque and the Park Service's preferred granite base. It was shipped to Hawaii and held by the Park Service until December 7th, 1990 (Pearl Harbor day), when an appropriate ceremony was held, with all befitting military pomp and ceremony, including a Marine Corp band and Guard of Honor.

IN THE BEGINNING



he first agenda item for the California Society of the S.A.R. on board the H.M.S. Queen Mary in Long Beach Harbor on April 25th, 1981 was to approve the establishment of the proposed San Fernando Valley Chapter. State Secretary Carl H. Lamb advised the Board of Managers that we had met all the requirements. Next President Joseph W. McLark called for the vote. It Was Unanimous! We were the first new Chapter in the California Society, S.A.R. in twenty-five years.

Accepting the Charter which is reproduced below, was then President Donald Moran and then First Vice-President Major (now Lt. Colonel) James Bellah, II.

That charter presentation was the culmination of a year's work. Several of our founding members met at the S.C.G.S. library with the President and of the Los Angeles Chapter and discussed our desire to form a Chapter in the Valley. Three of these men, LtV. James Bellah, Roger E. Robertson and Donald Norman Moran were already members of the S.A.R. It was decided that the idea was sound and we received the requirements we had to meet. The most difficult was having ten S.A.R. members in good standing. We started recruiting. Charles D. Barnard agreed to join, Berni K. Campbell agreed; Robert C. Emrey agreed; Bruce A. Jagger

agreed; Donald Ross McDowell agreed; Troy A. Reed agreed, and Robert G. Steele agreed. That made ten members, counting Bellah, Robertson and Moran who already were S.A.R. members. All ten are still active members after ten years! With the assistance of the Los Angeles Chapter, these seven applications were pushed through the approval cycle. Time was against us. We had to have ten approved members. LtC Clifton R. Brooks, M.D. agreed to transfer his Washington, D.C. membership to our Chapter as a dual member. Then William David Tullis filed his S.A.R. application - We had more than enough men, but several were still "applicants".

Time ran out, April 25th, 1981 was upon us. We went to the State meeting without the required number of members. Our petition to form a new Chapter appeared very doubtful and since the general membership of the State Society met but once a year, we would have to wait a full year for our charter.

Long time members of the S.A.R. kept advising us with a cliché that wasn't to become popular for another nine years: "Don't worry, be happy". Then something wonderful happened. A number of members of the Society approached us saying they'd like to help us get started by becoming dual members. They were: Arden H. Brame, then President of the Pasadena Chapter. Glendon Hall, then Secretary of the Los Angeles Chapter. Thomas Hatton then President of the Orange County Chapter; John Justice, then President of the Los Angeles Chapter. All four signed the Charter papers before the start of the Board of Managers meeting of the CASSAR.

We immediately elected a group

of hardworking workaholics to office. Donald Norman Moran, our first President (He had an operation and missed the first election meeting - so!). LtC James Bellah, II, 1st V.P.; LtC Clifton R. Brooks, M.D. 2nd V.P. Robert Charles Emrey Secretary /Treasurer, Berni K. Campbell Registrar, a position, he still holds and Rev. Dr. ROBERT J. WILEY. as our first Chaplain.

Membership growth was extremely important. If we were to become a viable Chapter, we had to have a good membership base.

During the balance of 1981 we all worked on membership. We were very successful. We brought into the S.A.R. the following Compatriots, all are considered Charter members of the Chapter:

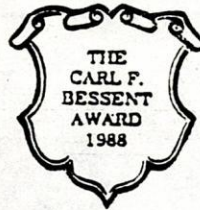

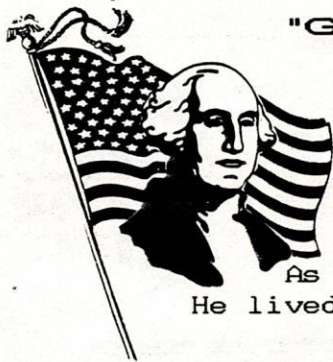

We said goodbye to those bad men.

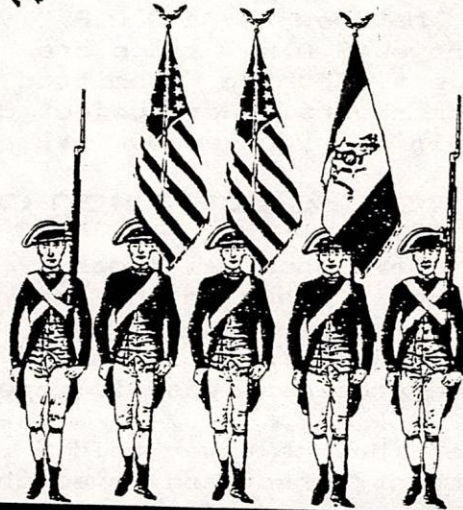
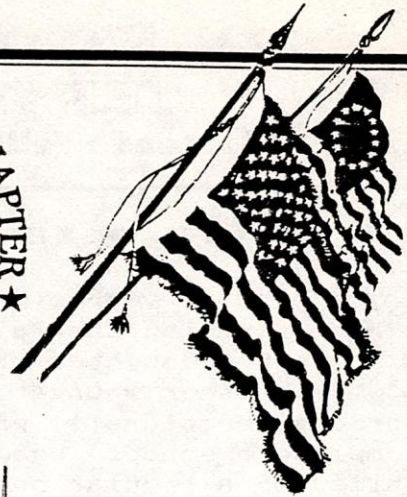

on the very day he died."

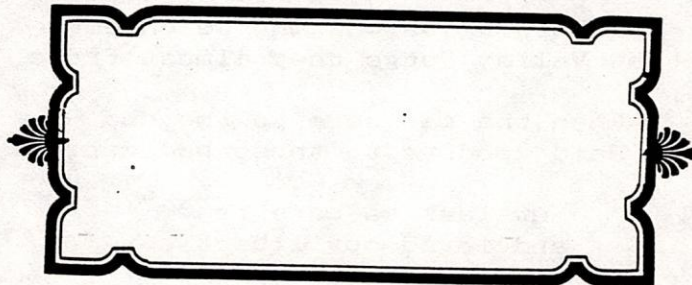
